Practical suggestions for introducing handbells into a modern worship setting

Be excellent Be relevant Children's program Begin with "High Holy" seasons; Lent/Easter – Advent/Christmas Play FAMILIAR songs; contemporary or traditional, even "secular" Demographic of the handbell ensemble should mirror the demographic of the congregation The attire of the ensemble should mirror the attire of the congregation/staff

Adding bells to a Contemporary Worship Ensemble (Praise Band)

Learning to read a chord chart/lead sheet Ringers need to "know" the song, be able to sing it Listen When to play and when not to play Descants Using bells & chimes to set the "mood" of the piece or the service Often songs have a repetitive harmonic structure. Just like in a traditional setting, it will lend itself to adding high descant, utilizing the pentatonic scale On quiet song, double the bass part with chimes Bells are most effective in songs that have a reduced texture

Ringing from a Chord Chart & Simple Arrangements

Amazing Grace My Chains are Gone This Is Amazing Grace Lord, I Need You How Great Is Our God

Take the bells on the road

Particularly in context of Modern Worship; handbell choirs should be a ministry opportunity and outreach of the church, not just a "performing" ensemble Perform outside the church: retirement homes, prisons, Sunday evening concerts at other churches
